Sew your own paper-pieced vegetables for a fun little quilt celebrating summer's bounty.

Quilt size: 12" x 17"

MATERIALS

Assorted Scraps
 Black/White Stripe ½ yard
 White/Black Blotch fat ⅛ (9" x 20")
 Backing 14" x 20"
 Batting 14" x 20"
 Foundation paper

CUTTING

Patches for foundation piecing are cut as you go.

FROM THE BLACK/WHITE STRIPE

To make bias binding, cut 1 square 15" x 15". Then cut this square into 2¼" strips on the bias. Join the strips end to end with ¼" seams. Press the seam allowances open, and press the bias strip in half, wrong sides together. Set it aside.

Cut the remaining stripe yardage into 1" strips across the width of the fabric. From these strips cut:

- 12 A 1" x 3½"
- 1 B 1" x 15"
- 2 C 1" x 11½"
- 4 D 1" x 4½"

FROM THE WHITE WITH BLACK BLOTCH

Cut 2 squares 6¼" x 6¼". Cut the squares diagonally twice (Fig. 1) to make E's. You will have 2 extra E's.

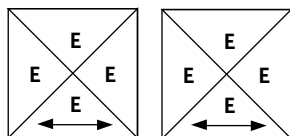

Cut 2 squares 3¾" x 3¾". Cut the squares diagonally once to make F's (Fig. 2).

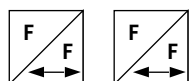


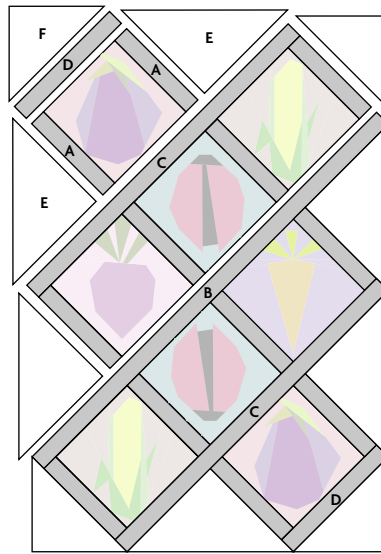

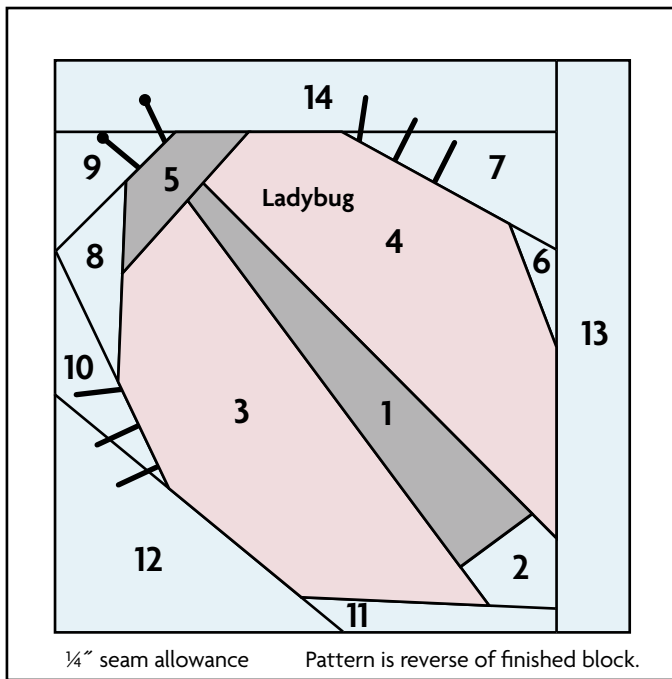

ASSEMBLY

- 1** Print the block foundations. Use a variety of scraps to paper piece the blocks, adding patches in numerical order. Press the completed blocks and trim the seam allowances to $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
- 2** Referring to the quilt assembly diagram, arrange the blocks, sashing strips A-D, and E's in diagonal rows. Join the rows. Add the F's to the corners.
- 3** Layer and baste together the backing, batting, and quilt top. Quilt in the ditch around the motifs, blocks, and sashes.
- 4** Use the prepared striped bias binding to bind the quilt.
