
## Cinco de Mayo designed and made by Pam rocco

Pam Rocco's pants pocket block - see "Words to Quilt By," page 84, in the February/March 2012 issue of Quilters Newsletter - goes festive in this one-block quilt. Cinco de Mayo is a great stash-busting project.

## **ASSEMBLY**

- Wash, starch and press fabrics. Cut the patches and strips listed in the materials and cutting box and shown in the rotary cutting diagrams.
- Referring to the block piecing diagram, join 2 A's and 2 B's, noting the A's will be slightly wider than the B's. Trim the short ends of the A's even with the edges of the B's. Join 2 C's to the A/B to make a block. Make 24 blocks.

**B** Referring to the quilt assembly diagram and working on a design wall or large flat surface, arrange the blocks in 6 rows of 4 blocks each, paying attention to the orientation of the blocks. Join the 8 center blocks as shown. Trim this center panel to 20" x 41", keeping the blocks centered. Join the 41" black strips to the sides of the center panel then join the remaining black strips to the top and bottom of the center panel. Return the center panel to the design wall.



## MATERIALS AND CUTTING

Requirements are for 42" fabric width.

Binding	1/2	6 binding strips 2¼" x 42"
Backing	23/4	2 panels 34" x 46"
Batting		46" x 67"

TECHNIQUES USED: machine piecing, template piecing, machine quilting
