

A Witches' Brew

DESIGNED AND MADE BY LINDA MILLER

Linda Miller of Missoula, Montana designed this fast-and-easy table runner using fabrics from the **Witchy Poo** collection by RJR Fabrics. The border takes advantage of the print for a totally painless 8" wide border that appears to have been pieced. The fun and spooky table runner will be a hit in your Halloween decorations.



MATERIALS AND CUTTING

Requirements are based on 42" fabric width. Borders are cut lengthwise. Borders are the exact length required plus seam allowances.

BLOCK SIZE: 6" **QUILT SIZE:** 28" x 52"

MATERIALS	YDS.	CUTTING
Black Print	¼	6 A
Multi Stripe	⅝	5 binding strips 2¼" x 42", 6 A
Border Print	1⅞	2 borders 8½" x 36½", 2 borders 8½" x 28½"
Backing	1⅓	1 panel 32" x 56"
Batting		32" x 56"

TECHNIQUES USED: machine piecing, butted borders, machine quilting

ASSEMBLY

1 Wash, starch and press fabrics.

Cut the patches listed in the materials and cutting box and shown in the rotary cutting diagrams. Cut the borders lengthwise, centering each border strip on the same repeat.

2 Referring to Fig. 1, layer a stripe A on a black print A with right sides together. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner. Stitch a ¼" seam on both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line and press the triangles open to make two blocks. Make 12 blocks. ▶

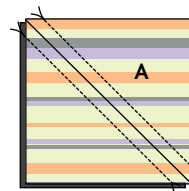
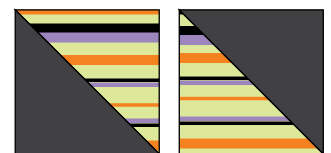

FREE PATTERN

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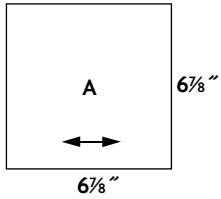
3 Referring to the quilt assembly diagram and working on a design wall or large, flat surface, arrange the blocks in 6 rows of 2 blocks paying attention to the orientation of the blocks. Join the blocks in rows then join the rows.

4 Join the 36½" borders to the sides of the quilt. Join the remaining borders to the top and bottom of the quilt.

5 Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Baste. Quilt in the ditch around the patches in the blocks and quilt straight lines in the borders, using the stripes as a guide, or quilt as desired. Bind the quilt to finish. 

ROTARY CUTTING

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.
