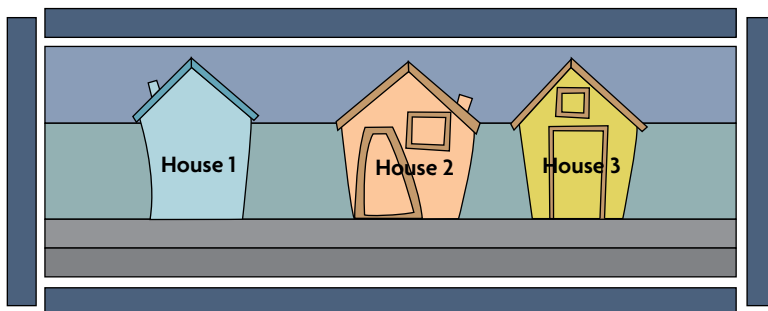
It's Trick or Treat time on Halloween Street, and you're invited! A simple pieced background sets the stage for the raw-edge applique neighborhood scene. Khalsa used a few choice Halloween-themed fabric collections: Scary Night 2 by Laurie Godin for Northcott for the background and borders; Costume Club by Sheri Berry Designs for Lyndhurst Studio, Stitchy Witchy Haunts by Robert Kaufman and Don't Be Afraid by Deborah Edwards for Northcott were all used for the fussy-cut characters, windows and doorways. The best way to make this design your own is to choose characters and motifs that appeal to you.

ASSEMBLY

1 Wash and press fabrics. Cut the strips listed in the materials and cutting box. Wait to cut applique patches.

2 Referring to the quilt assembly diagram, join the star print strip, landscape print strip, black & gray print strip and black tone-on-tone strip to make the pieced background.

3 Referring to the quilt photo for color placement, prepare house and chimney appliques from assorted brights for fusible raw-edge applique. Referring to the quilt assembly diagram, applique onto the pieced background. Prepare the roofs, windows and doorways from assorted dark stripes for fusible raw-edge applique, and applique them onto the houses. ▶



QUILT ASSEMBLY

MATERIALS AND CUTTING

Requirements are based on 40" fabric width.

QUILT SIZE: 15" x 39"

Stars Print	1/3	3 binding strips 2 1/4" x 40", 1 strip 4 1/2" x 36 1/2"
Landscape Print*	1/4	1 strip 5 1/2" x 36 1/2"
Black & Gray Print	1/8	1 strip 2" x 36 1/2"
Black Tone-on-tone	1/8	1 strip 2" x 36 1/2"
Assorted Brights	1/4	applique patches
Assorted Dark Stripes	scraps	applique patches
Halloween Prints*	1/8 each or scraps	fussy-cut applique patches
Navy & Black Print	1/4	2 borders 2" x 36 1/2", 2 borders 2" x 15 1/2"
Backing	1 1/3	1 panel 19" x 43"
Batting		19" x 43"


*Purchase additional fabric for fussy-cutting

ALSO NEEDED: fusible web for fusible applique

TECHNIQUES USED: machine piecing, fusible raw-edge machine applique, fussy cutting, machine quilting

4 Referring to the quilt photo, fussy cut motifs – jack-o'-lanterns, ghosts, witches, monsters and costumed characters from the Halloween prints – and prepare them for fusible raw-edge applique. Applique the fussy-cut shapes onto the pieced background as shown or as desired.

5 Join the 2" x 36½" borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Join the 2" x 15½" borders to the sides of the quilt.

6 Mark quilting motifs as desired. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Baste. Quilt around the appliques, just inside the cut line, then quilt marked motifs or as desired. Bind the quilt to finish.

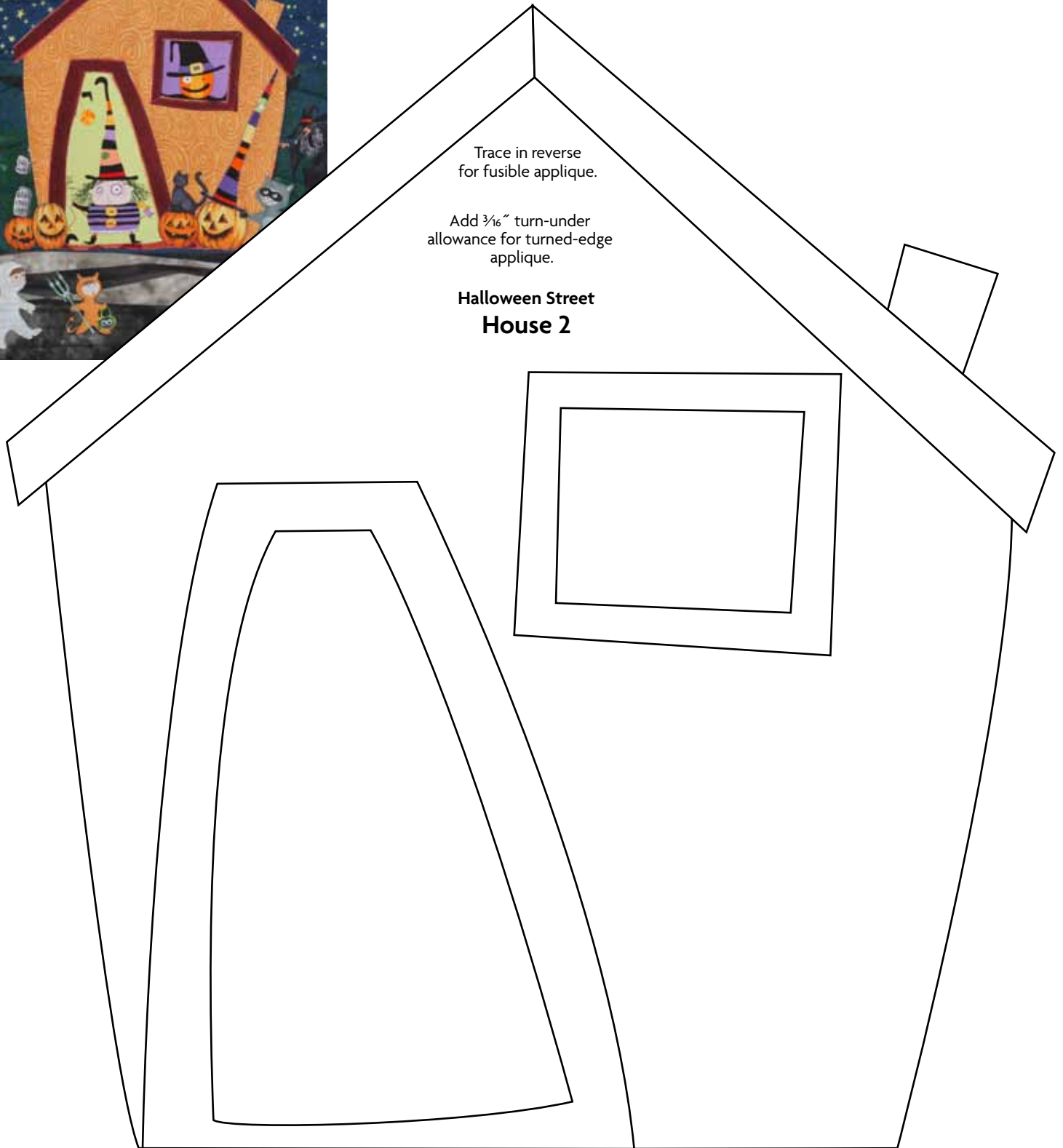
