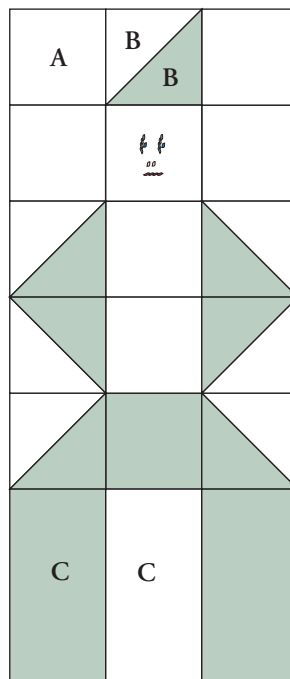
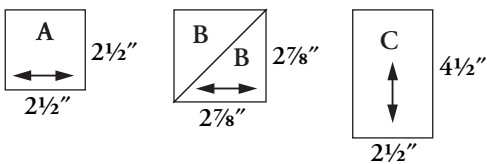
6" x 14"

- ❶ From a light background fabric, cut 7 A, 7 B, and 1 C. From a khaki or brown fabric, cut 1 A, 7 B, and 2 C.
- ❷ Sew a light and dark B together to make a B/B unit. Make 7 B/B units. Arrange all patches according to the block diagram. If you're making a quilt with several Soldier Boy blocks, rotate the B/B unit to make the soldier's hat slant in the opposite direction in half of the blocks.
- ❸ Sew the A's, B/B's, and C's into rows, and then sew the rows together to complete the block. Embroider a face on the soldier as shown in the block photo.

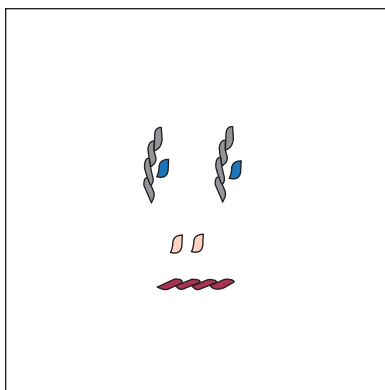


## Rotary Cutting

Measurements include  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.  
Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.
