

Quilt Back

Miss Kitty

The pattern for *Miss Kitty*, designed and made by Janine Holzman of Sitka, Alaska, is in the May 2007 issue of *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine*. Janine added a small 42" x 44" strippy quilt on the back side of the quilt. The patterns for each of the seven vertical rows in this quilt will be given in seven installments on the QuiltersNewsletter.com website. Look for a new pattern each month.

Janine used scraps for the background, blocks, and sashes. If you wish to use the same light print for all the backgrounds, you'll need 1½ yards. You'll also need ¾ yard for the binding and 2¾ yards for the backing.

The Kitty in a Basket applique pattern can be fused or stitched as you desire. Cut a cream background strip 5½" x 42½". Fold the strip in half lengthwise to find the center. Place each kitty and basket on the strip, aligning the dotted line with the fold line. The baskets are placed about 1" apart. Use your judgment to arrange them evenly. Fuse or stitch in place. Embroider the cats' faces.

Sew a 1" x 42½" red strip to each long side. Set the vertical row aside.
